Categories / Classes:

Current International shooting classification system will be used. Categories will be established if there are 5 or more competitors per category.

Less than 5 competitors will be combined with competitors of a higher classification to form a class. No other classified competitor will be combined with the Master class.

Cash will be awarded for Winner and others in each match. Awards:

Courses of Fire:

Free Pistol: Fired at 50 yards on 50 meter reduced (B-19) targets. Time 2 hours includes sighters.

Standard Pistol: Fired at 25 yards on 25 meter reduced (B-19) targets. Four 5 -shot series. Slow Fire 2 ½ minutes per series; Four 5 - shot series, 20 seconds per series; Four 5 - shot Series in 10 seconds each.

Center Fire / Sport Pistol: Fired at 25 yards on 25 meter reduced (B-19) targets and (B-38) targets. 30 shots slow fire on B19 target and 30 shots Rapid Fire on (B-38) target. Precision Fire; 5 shots in 5 minutes, Rapid Fire sequence is 7 seconds edged, 3 seconds faced.

"Note that the .22 Sport Pistol Match is only for Women and Junior men".

Air Pistol: Fired at 10 meters on electronic targets. Preparation and unlimited sighters for 15 minutes and 60 shots for record fired in one hour and fifteen minutes.

Categories / Classes:

For the Service Pistol Championship ONLY: Competitors will be divided into two categories: (1) Civilian, and (2) Service. The Service Category will include Regular, Reserve, National Guard, and Police. With fewer than 5 competitors in a category, the categories will be combined within the same class. With fewer than 5 competitors in a combined class, the competitors will be moved to the next higher class (except Master to High Master). Each match will have an individual Match Winner. In each class and category with 5-8 competitors, excluding a Match Winner, there will be a first place in class winner. With 9-15 competitors, a second place in class will be awarded.

Match winners will not be eligible for any class award in the same match. In such cases, the class award will be passed on to the next ranking eligible score. A competitor will not be eligible for more than one award per match. In the event of at least 2 but fewer than 5 Master or High Master shooters, a winner or first in class will be paid, with only one Master or High Master shooter, match winner only will be paid.

Awards:

Cash awards will be provided for individual matches and for Match 5. In addition, the AZ resident winner of Match 5 will be declared the Arizona State Service Pistol Champion and will receive an additional cash award of \$25.

Categories / Classes: The NRA Classification system will be used. Separate class awards will be given in each of two Categories: Civilian and Service. Members of the active Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, National Guard, and Reserve components will make up the Service Category. Members of Federal, State, County, Municipal law enforcement groups and Industrial Police are also included in the Service Category. All others will be considered Civilians (Rule 2.2).

- 1. If there are less than five entries in any category within a class, they will be combined with other entries in another category within the same class.
- 2. If there are less than five entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be NO AWARDS provided in that class and all competitors in the lower class will be moved to their respective category in the next higher class.
- 3. If the five-competitor minimum required for award purposes has still not been fulfilled, competitors will be moved up in class and category until there are five or more in a class and category.
- 4. A class or category will not be combined downward. If there are less than five High Masters, they will compete for MATCH WINNER only.

Awards:

Cash awards will be issued to shooters for matches and aggregate matches by class and category. The high Senior, Grand Senior, Woman and Junior will receive a \$10 award

Service Pistol, .22, Revolver, and Air Pistol Excellence in Competition Matches CMP Sanctioned Matches

The CMP Service Pistol EIC, .22 Rimfire EIC, Service Revolver EIC, and Air Pistol EIC matches are sponsored by the Phoenix Rod and Gun Club, Pistol Division

Eligibility: Open to all that can be accommodated during the week. You need not be a member of the NRA or a CMP affiliated club to participate. You must have a CMP competitor number if you want your scores tracked. You may sign up only for EIC events if you choose.

Time, Date & Match Fees:

Matches will be held from Tuesday through Saturday; see Page 1 schedule.

Fees are \$20 per .22, Service Pistol, and Revolver EIC matches and \$15 for the AP EIC match. Collegiates / Juniors pay \$10 and \$7, respectively.

Courses of Fire: .22 and Service Pistol EIC - the 30 shot National Match Course of fire, 50/25 yds.

Service Revolver EIC – the 40 shot President's Pistol Match course of fire, 50/25yds.

Air Pistol EIC – Fired at 10 meters on electronic targets. Preparation and unlimited sighters for 15 minutes and 60 shots for record fired in one hour and fifteen minutes.

Firearms and ammunition: "Service Pistol," ".22 Rimfire Pistol", "Revolver", "Air Pistol", and ammunition as defined in the Current Edition of the CMP rules.

Entries: There must be at least six non-distinguished shooters. Non-Distinguished shooters will get priority.

Awards: Gold, Silver & Bronze Achievement Pins will be presented to competitors (Distinguished or Non-Distinguished) in CMP-Sanctioned EIC Matches that equal or exceed Achievement Award Scores. Points are given to any non-distinguished shooters who place in the top ten percent of non-distinguished shooters, provided that the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC Minimum Credit Score. All Points are issued by the CMP.

Minimum EIC Scores – To receive EIC credit points, the score fired by the competitor must fulfill the requirements of the CMP rules (top 10%) and equal or exceed the EIC Minimum Credit Score (MCS) for that discipline. MCS scores are:

- Service Pistol. 250 of 300
- .22 Rimfire Pistol, 260 of 300
- Service Revolver. 315 of 400
- Air Pistol, 540 of 600

Rules: All EIC matches will be conducted in accordance with the CMP Rules in effect on the date of the match.
